THE Nigerian Oil and Gas Technical Conference, which will focus on technology development, innovation and training within the upstream, midstream and downstream oil and gas markets, will hold at the Eko Expo Centre, from June 8 to 10, 2010 in Lagos.

NOG Tech is a new partner event by the organisers of Nigeria Oil and Gas (NOG), which was opened by President Jonathan recently and attracts over 7000 participants yearly.

It was developed in response to the growing need for a technical conference and exhibition in Lagos at the heart of the oil and gas industry.

Speakers for the event include Special Advisor to the President on Petroleum Matters, Dr. Emmanuel Egbogah, Group Executive Director, Engineering & Technology (NNPC), Billy Agha, Group Executive Director, Corporate Services (NNPC), F. A Abbiyesuku, Senator Lee Maeba, President, Nigerian Society of Engineers Mr. Olumuyiwa Alade Ajibola; and Chairman, CresTech, Dr Olufemi A Lalude.

Maeba who was instrumental in first presenting the recently passed Nigerian Content Bill to the Senate back in 2005 will speak about the recently signed Nigerian Oil and Gas Industry Content Development Bill during the conference session on Training and Local Content in Nigeria's onshore and offshore industry.
