## Egbogah, Maeba, others to speak at NOG Tech Conference

Special Advisor to the President on Petroleum Matters, Dr Emmanuel Egbogah, and Chairman of Senate Committee on Petroleum, Senator Maeba, are among the key notable speakers for Nigeria Oil Gas Tech (NOG Tech) Conference and Exhibition, which is billed to start tomorrow.

Maeba will speak about the recently signed Nigerian Oil and Gas Industry Content Development Law during the conference session on Training and Local Content in Nigeria's onshore and offshore industry.

The organiser of NOG Tech conference said it would focus on technology developments, innovation and training within the upstream, midstream and downstream oil and gas markets.

It would also bring together senior decision-makers and industry experts involved in the biggest projects in the region.
